

View from the Left: Dems maturing, GOP regressing?

It used to be said that if one were not a Democrat when young, one had no heart; if one were not a Republican when old, one had no brain. The sentiment was that the Democratic Party, while caring, was not mature; the Republican Party, while mature, was not caring.

This saying is not heard much anymore. Today, the Democratic Party is the mature and responsible party, while the Republican Party has regressed into immaturity and irresponsibility.

In the 1960s young people who truly cared about others, who were truly compassionate and empathetical, screamed and yelled, and expressed their caring in hateful riotous outbreaks, throwing bricks and hurtful words at those who disagreed with their desire for social justice. This was an anomalous situation indeed, but not a non-understandable one.

These people lacked the maturity to understand that they should think before acting; that they should funnel their caring into constructive avenues, instead expressing themselves in the language of babies, tantrums - awful, hurtful, violent tantrums. They cared but acted out without regard to consequence. They acted without thought. They were immature. They were irresponsible. Although they did not represent the majority of the Democratic Party, they were often Democrats.

In the 1960s the Republican Party, which truly thought that the financially responsible thing to do was to fight against Medicare did indeed fight against that program. The Republican Party did not want to spend the people's money, and it wanted seniors to take care of themselves, even those who could not do so. This was a mature approach, but it was empathy-less, compassionless, and it was hurtful - very hurtful.

Then it all began to change. In the 1970s Democrat Jerry Brown - a mature young man who was a fiscal conservative - became governor, and clamped down on unwise spending. In the 1990s Democrat Bill Clinton (with the help of some Republicans in Congress who were still holding to the ideals of responsibility) balanced what had been thought to be an unbalanceable federal budget. To the immature, to the irresponsible, spending money that one does not have is never a problem because children don't worry about paying bills. They are inherently irresponsible.

And why stop at spending the people's money (current and far into the future) when there's all sorts of money that can be gambled by "conservative" bankers - without regard to the consequence of the risk of loss. Mommy and Daddy (the federal treasury) will pay off the loan sharks if they get nasty. Put up \$1, borrow \$39 and let it ride. Who cares about paying the \$39 back if craps are thrown. Mommy and Daddy will take care of it. These immature banker bets were allowed by the Republicans at the Securities and Exchange Commission, the Bush Administration, and the Republican Congress.

And they were paid off, lest the loan sharks harm us all.

And, what generally happens after spoiled kids get bailed out by their parents? Do they reform? Do they grow up? Generally not. Generally they just go back to their immature ways.
